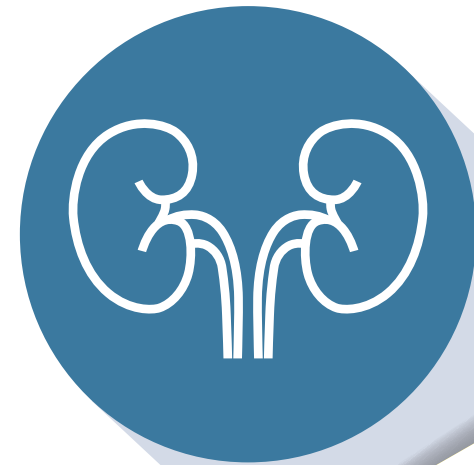




# Acute Kidney Injury Competency Framework

1 The nurse can competently identify and conduct the necessary tests required in the home to support the resident with suspected AKI.					
2 The nurse has been able to develop a comprehensive plan of care in order to support a resident who may be at risk if developing AKI.					
3 The nurse is able to collect residents urine samples as per instructions i.e. mid- morning sample, clean catch or catheter.					
4 The nurse is able to conduct an adequate visual assessment of the residents urine output and complete a urinalysis to determine clarity.					
5 The nurse can identify and promote preventative measures to support the residents at risk of AKI.					
6 The nurse is able to consider, identify any reverse and contributing any modifiable risk factors associated with AKI.					
7 The nurse understands and can act upon abnormal blood results appropriately.					
8 The nurse is able to develop a robust treatment plan to prevent AKI following a residents post-operative intervention, or episode of hospital admission.					
9 The nurse understands the differences between an resident presenting with Acute or Chronic kidney Injury (CKD).					
10 The nurse is able to develop a long term treatment plan for a resident who has been identified with suffering from CKD and understands the staging process.
